The Agency works under the direction of the Chief Electoral Officer, an officer of the Legislative Assembly."</p> <p>Elections Canada "Elections Canada is an independent, non-partisan agency that reports directly to Parliament. The Agency must be prepared at all times to conduct a federal general election, by-election or referendum, administer the political financing provisions of the <i>Canada Elections Act</i>, monitor compliance and enforce electoral legislation. Elections Canada is also mandated to conduct voter education and information programs, and provide support to the independent boundaries commissions in charge of adjusting the boundaries of federal electoral districts following each decennial census.
