PUBLIC NOTICE: VACANCIES – CITY OF DRYDEN BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

An invitation is extended to the citizens of the City of Dryden to submit applications to serve on the following City of Dryden Boards/Committees. Appointments for this term will be until March 31, 2011 except as provided by statutory or other requirements.

CITY OF DRYDEN CULTURAL ROUNDTABLE (Vacancies remaining for [4 to 7] public representatives and [1] youth representative)

In June 2009, the Council of the City of Dryden adopted a Municipal Cultural Strategy for the City of Dryden. Included in the strategy was a commitment from City Council to establish a permanent Committee, referred to as the City of Dryden Cultural Roundtable. The Cultural Roundtable is responsible for acting as a catalyst to strengthen cultural development by supporting collaboration across community, business and municipal departments and interest groups. It will serve the community of Dryden by using the collective diversity and wisdom of its members to support the evolution of a Municipal Cultural Policy to fulfill the Municipal Cultural Strategy. A copy of the City of Dryden Cultural Strategy is available at the Dryden Public Library, the Clerk's Office and on the City of Dryden website at www.dryden.ca.

In June 2010, a revised composition of the Cultural Roundtable was approved by Council. The Roundtable will now consist of 9 to 13 members including:

- One (1) representative from Council
- One (1) member appointed from the Dryden Area Cultural Partnership
- Two (2) members appointed from Aboriginal organizations /communities
- Four to seven (4-7) representatives from the public
(preference given to cultural entrepreneurs or multi cultural groups)**
- One (1) member from the public representing youth (Age 18 to 30)**
